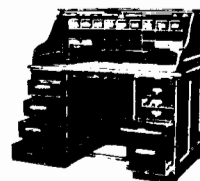

This issue contains more records, in terms of total names searched, than probably any other issue of the Upshaw Family Journal. Most of the records herein, representing literally millions of names, are from printed census indexes to various censuses outside the deep Southern states, the purpose of which searches is to locate in certain geographical areas and time periods any Upshaw families for further research or to eliminate those possibilities. There is some enlightening data found in Kentucky, Indiana, and Illinois, but most of these other areas only reflect negative research. Readers should refer to UFJ, vol. I, no. 2, for many census indexes which complement these.

I have recently begun investigations on our behalf of St. Clair Co., Alabama, Erath Co., Texas, Noxubee Co., Mississippi, and Randolph Co., Arkansas, which I hope will more fully document and illuminate Upshaw families in those areas.

The Volume IV index will be completed later this year and, hopefully, mailed with the first issue of Volume V in January.

The first issue of Volume V will feature Georgia records and will mark the beginning of our fifth year as an Association. We are especially thankful at this milestone to those who joined with us in 1974 and are still with us, for it is their persistent support which has sustained our organization and has enabled us to develop into one of the best family organizations in the country today. They have had the wisdom and the patience to realize that a year or two of membership in an organization does not bring the full rewards that a sustained membership does; rewards which include:

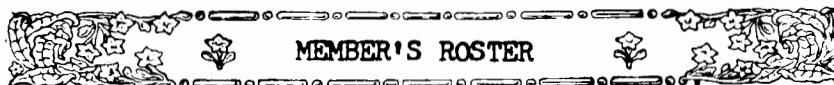

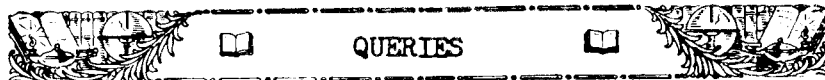

Couple are found dead; Man, 65, and wife felled by gas in home on 15th Street.

A couple were found dead at 2 P. M. yesterday in their one-and-a-half room apartment at 328 West Fifteenth Street. The deaths apparently were accidental, according to the police.

The bodies of Arthur Upshaw, 65 years old, and his wife, Margaret, were discovered fully clothed on the floor and on the bed, respectively, in the third-floor apartment after another tenant had traced a gas odor.

All windows were found shut. Food had apparently been in preparation on the stove, which had two gas jets open, with burners unlit, and a lit oven. The police said they believed the couple were trying to heat the apartment.

Mrs. Upshaw Dead; Ex-Aide of Court; Headed Domestic Relations Bureau of First such Judicial body here in 1910; Widow of U. S. Official; Husband, Friend of Cleveland, Directed Indian Bureau - Owned Newspaper Chain.

Mrs. Ida T. Upshaw, a pioneer in domestic relations work in this city and widow of the Indian Commissioner for the United States under President Cleveland, died Saturday of a heart ailment at her home, 230 Riverside Drive, at the age of 83. She had been ill for some time.

Mrs. Upshaw was born in Columbia, Tenn., a daughter of James Houston Thomas and Averilla Harper Thomas. She was educated in the South and attended the Atheneum, a college for women in her home State. While at school, she devoted much of her time to the study of law.

In 1876 she was married to General Alexander Bradford Upshaw, an attorney and owner of a chain of Southern newspapers which included the present Nashville Tennessean. From the time of her marriage to the end of the century, Mrs. Upshaw was a constant contributor of editorials and articles on politics to many of her husband's newspapers.

General and Mrs. Upshaw were close friends of the Cleveland family and were often seen at the White House during President Cleveland's Administration.

In 1900, Mrs. Upshaw entered service in the domestic relations field, having been appointed a superintendent in the Bureau of Charities by Homer Folks, who was then Commissioner.

She took a leading part in the establishment of the system which eventually led to the foundation of domestic relations courts. In September, 1910, she headed the domestic relations bureau here of the first court of that kind. For the next eighteen years she held similar posts in Manhattan, the Bronx and Richmond, serving seven courts.

At her retirement in 1934, she was deputy chief probation officer of the Manhattan Family Division of the City Magistrates' Courts.

Mrs. Upshaw leaves two sons, John R. of this city and Arthur C. of Miami Beach, Fla.; and two daughters, Miss May B. Upshaw, Director of Examinations for Civil Service for the City of New York, and Mrs. Everett Horgan of Rye.

Upshaw, William D.;

William Upshaw, Prohibitionist, 86; Party's Presidential Candidate in '32, Ex-Congressman Known as 'Driest of Drys' is Dead.

Glendale, Calif., Nov. 21 (AP) - William D. Upshaw, author, lecturer and preacher who, as a United States Representative, won the sobriquet "Dryest of the Drys", died today of a circulatory ailment in Glendale Sanitarium. He was 86 years old. His wife, the former Mrs. Lily Galloway, past president of the California Women's Christian Temperance Union, was at his side.

The one-time Prohibition party candidate for President became ill after returning to his home in near-by Santa Monica from an extended speaking tour in twenty two states and seven European countries.

Mr. Upshaw went to Congress in 1919 from Georgia's Fifth District as a Democrat and served for eight years. In 1932, he polled 80,000 votes as the Prohibition party's Presidential candidate.

For years a lecturer in schools and churches on the "evils of liquor", Mr. Upshaw was ordained a Baptist minister at the age of 72 and continued his attack on alcohol from the pulpit on mission tours. He wrote seven books - collections of poetry, patriotic essays and sermons.

Born on a farm near Newman(sic), Ga., Mr. Upshaw suffered a spinal injury at 18 in a fall from a wagon. He was bedfast for seven years and then used crutches until last February, when, his wife said, for the first time since his injury he was able to walk unaided.

While an invalid, Mr. Upshaw wrote poems and sketches and lectured from a wheelchair. He earned enough money through these efforts to enter Mercer University at Macon, Ga., at 31. Later he founded a newspaper in Atlanta, the Golden Age, and published it for ten years.

During his career he had been vice president of the Anti-Saloon League in Georgia and president of the National Christian Citizenship Foundation, a benevolent and patriotic organization.

Mr. Upshaw married Mrs. Galloway in 1946 after the death of his first wife, the former Margaret Beverly of Thomasville, Ga. He is survived also by two daughters of the first marriage, Mrs. Charles Whitworth of Atlanta and Mrs. Singleton Wolfe of Nashville, Tenn.
