

Although we have some early Colonial and English records in our unpublished files, this new research will have to be done by one of several reputable genealogists and, to be properly done, will be rather expensive.

If we indeed hope to succeed, it will not be done by half-hearted intentions and weak resolve, but by sincerity and firm commitment. Our prospects for success are enhanced by the fact that no serious Upshaw research of English records has ever been done. In my judgement, we should be able to invest a minimum of \$500, and preferably more, to launch a serious research effort. The strength of our organization is in our numbers and it is obvious that there is great strength in uniting toward a common goal, so I appeal to every Upshaw descendant to participate in the financial support of this effort. The time is now; please help!




